









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COLORS STORY



•----> •Background:

The flag has a sky blue or turquoise background, representing the sky, water, and unity.

•Sun:

A golden sun with 32 rays is centered on the flag, symbolizing life, energy, wealth, and abundance. The rays are shaped like grain, representing prosperity.

•Steppe Eagle:

A golden steppe eagle in flight is positioned below the sun, symbolizing power, freedom, and the flight to the future.

•Koshkar-Muiz Pattern:

A golden ornamental pattern called "koshkar-muiz" (horns of the ram) is placed on the hoist side, representing Kazakh art and culture, and the importance of goat and sheep herding.

•Design:

The flag was designed by Shaken Niyazbekov.

•History

The flag was adopted on June 4, 1992, replacing the flag of the Kazakh Soviet Socialist Republic.


· Chapan (Yanart) - traditional outernear , worn by kazakh men and women.

· Shapan (Wanat) - A long robe with detailed embroidery, often given as a sign of respect.

· Headwear & Accessories - Embellished on takiya (skullcapes), bets, and

· Footwear - Seen in Kazakh boots (sapogi or ichigi), adding decorative

This pattern was often embrosolered with gold or solver threads to indicate














+ The Koshlar Muiz (Prain's Horn) motif is a prosperity. This pattern is promoverly featured on Findericanal texiles such as Alasha (lint-free carpets) and Baskur (decoratives woven bands). In these texsles. the Koshkar Musz motif curls or spirals representing ram's horns. These dasigns are typically worken using contrasting colors to highlights the intricate patterns.

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




* Saukele : A Fraditional bridal headdress, the saukete 5s a gall conscal had adorned with various ornaments and embrosdery. The koshbar Muiz motif is commonly intergrated into it's design, symbolizing prosperity and serving as a cultural emblem during significant life events.

* These traditional hats not only serve practical purposes but also function as expressions of cultural identify, with the Koshkar Muiz motif playing a central role on their decorative elements
